

Biographies



Akira Tatehata

Poet and art critic specializing in modern and contemporary art. Born in Kyoto in 1947 and graduated from Waseda University's Faculty of Letters, Department of French Literature, in 1972. He has served as director of the National Museum of Art, Osaka, president of Kyoto City University of Arts, director of the Saitama Museum of Modern Art, and president of Tama Art University. He has organized many international art exhibitions, including serving as the Japan Pavilion Commissioner at the Venice Biennale (1990 and

1993), artistic director of Yokohama Triennale 2001 and Aichi Triennale 2010. Tatehata has also participated in many Asian modern and contemporary art projects. His major books include the collection of poems *Runner on the Margin* (1991), *Questionless Answers Objects and Sculptures* (1998), and *Paintings of the Unfinished Past and Modernism* (2000). He received the Takami Jun Prize for his poetry collection *Zerodo no Inu* (2004) and the Hagiwara Sakutaro Prize for Dead Language Lessons (2013). He is currently the chairman of the National Association of Art Museums (2013-).

Hiroki Yamamoto

Hiroki Yamamoto, born in Chiba in 1986, is a cultural studies scholar and Associate Professor at Jissen Women's University in Japan. Yamamoto graduated in Social Science at Hitotsubashi University, Tokyo, in 2010, and completed his MA in Fine Art at Chelsea College of Arts (UAL), London, in 2013. In 2018, he received a PhD from the University of the Arts London. After working at the Asia Culture Center in Gwangju, South Korea, as a research fellow, The Hong Kong

Polytechnic University as a postdoctoral fellow, and Tokyo University of the Arts as an Assistant Professor, he was a Lecturer at Kanazawa College of Art until 2023. His single-authored publications are *The History of Contemporary Art: Euro-America, Japan, and Transnational* (Chuokoron-Shinsha, 2019) and *Art of the Post-Anthropocene* (Bijutsu Shuppan-Sha, 2022).



Yoichi Nishio

Editor-in-Chief of Casa BRUTUS, born in 1976, he joined Magazine House after graduating from the School of Law at Waseda University in 2001. After working in the editorial departments of Tarzan, relax, and anan, he joined the editorial department of Casa BRUTUS in 2012, and was appointed editor-in-chief in 2018.



Azabudai Hills Gallery will host workshop programs related to this exhibition in July and August. Details will be announced in mid-May.




The main visual by SLOW inc. uses five different works including *Un effet du japonais*.
