Session Highlights

1) Leading-edge Technologies Sessions October 14 (Wed) from 13:00-15:00 and 15:30-17:30 Mr. Joichi ITO, Director, MIT Media Lab, will focus on the advancement of biotechnology in addressing the question of how urban microbiomes are impacting lifestyles. The second session will cover urban environment design involving urban microbiomes from the perspectives of hardware, software engineering and biotechnology.

2) Urban Development Sessions October 15 (Thu) from 13:00-15:00 and 15:30-17:30 The first part of this session will explore Tokyo's urban identity in an increasingly interconnected world. How could a city like Tokyo maintain its own uniqueness while increasing its attractiveness? The session will invite international experts on sociology, architecture and urban development to discuss urban identities in the age of globalization. The second part of the session will invite experts from London and New York to provide Tokyo with insights on city creation.

3) Art and Creativity Sessions October 16 (Fri) from 10:00-12:00 and 13:00-15:00 Both sessions will address the question of what should be the subjects of design. World-renowned designers, architects and artists will gather to discuss the possibility of redefining design.
